

"FROM OUR HOUSE TO YOURS" DAC AT ASI'S HOLIDAY EXHIBITION

One of Minnesota's most anticipated holiday experiences returned as the American Swedish Institute kicked off its 71st annual holiday celebration. Classic meets contemporary in this year's exhibition within



the Turnblad Mansion as guest curators representing Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Iceland, Finland, the Sami Culture Center, and the Hmong Museum, all come together this year at one, over-sized, oval table in the Ballroom to share stories and traditions though festive place settings and décor from the home.

This year we share not only the best in Danish design over three centuries, but food traditions that are uniquely Danish.

The exhibit features Danish table settings for holiday meals over three days of Christmas, December 24 - 26. For Juleaften, we of course highlight dinner. For Første Juledag, our placesetting is ready for morgenmad (breakfast). And for Anden Juledag, we are set for a Julefrokost (Christmas Luncheon).

Tableware includes the oldest hand painted Royal Copenhagen pattern "Musselmalet or blue fluted," (1775) in continuous production for 246 years; "Mega," (2000,) and the newest line, "Royal Creatures," introduced September 1, 2021. Holmegaard glass and antique Danish and Georg Jensen flatware and linens complement the table.

Rounding out the exhibit will be a jointly decorated Christmas tree. If you visit, keep an eye out for Danish contributions to the ornaments displayed: red and silver kræmmerhuse (hanging paper cones).

BEGINNING DANISH 2 COURSE STARTS DECEMBER 4

DANEBO READING CIRCLE PLANS FOR 2022

After finishing 2021 with a discussion on November 21 of Johannes V. Jensen's Danish classic novel set in the early 16th Century, their thoughts are now turned to the eight new books chosen for the new year. Unlike 2021 with five books by or about Danish authors, 2022 features only two, but these are very familiar names: Hans Christian Andersen and Karen Blixen/Isak Dinesen. Here is the full schedule:

Full details of each book will be available in the DANews for that month, often with a teaser in the month before. Books are generally available in local libraries, in bookstores, and online for purchase in print or eBook format. A few may be a little difficult to find, so starting early is a good idea.

The Brahmadells, the January selection, is one of the first books translated from Faroese into English. It tells the epic story of a family nicknamed "the Brahmadells" and reaches from the time of Danish rule through the national wakening and independence. From the publisher: Referred to as the "Faroese Moby-Dick" for its scope, importance, and literary approach, The Brahmadells is a playful, engrossing look at life in an island nation whose rich history is relatively unknown to most English readers.

The Danebo Reading Circle is open to all DAC members. Non-members may visit one session to try it out, but are encouraged to join the organization if they want to continue. The book group is grateful for all the support received from the Danish American Center and wishes everyone happy and healthy holidays! See you in 2022!!
