DANEBO READING CIRCLE

Sunday, January 19: 1:30-3:30pm

On January 19, the Danebo Reading Circle will discuss *A Fairy Tale* by the Danish writer Jonas T. Bengtsson, the author of two previous novels, *Amina's Letters* and *Submarino*. He has won several awards including the Danish Debutant Award and BG Bank First Book Award for his first novel and the Nordic Council Film Prize for the film adaptation of *Submarino*. *A Fairy Tale*, his third novel, won the Martin Andersen Nexø Literary Award and was a finalist for the Danish Radio Literature Prize for Best Novel of the Year. He lives in Copenhagen.

In *A Fairy Tale*, a young boy grows up with a loving father who has little respect for the law. They are always on the run, and as they move from place to place, the boy is often distraught to leave behind new friendships. Because it would be dicey for him to go to school, his anarchistic father gives him an unconventional education intended to contradict as much as possible the teachings of his own father, a small-town preacher. Ten years later, when the boy is entering adulthood, with a fake name and a monotonous job, he tries to conform to the demands of ordinary life. But the lessons of the past thwart his efforts, and questions about his father's childhood cannot be left unanswered.

Spanning the mid-1980s to the early twenty-first century in Copenhagen, this coming-of-age novel examines what it means to be a stranger in the modern world, and how, for better or for worse, a father's legacy is never passed on in any predictable fashion. As Lawrence Hill, author of *Someone Knows My Name*, writes "With controlled and measured prose, Jonas Bengtsson builds subtle suspense, describing the experiences of a young boy who is at once protected by his father's love and under constant threat of the darkness of their daily reality. *A Fairy Tale* is a profound and penetrating novel about the unbreakable bond between a father and son."

The February 16 gathering will discuss *Love*, the 1997 novel by Norwegian Hanne Ørstavik, published in English translation in 2017 by Martin Aitken. As at every meeting, come for good conversation—and treats!

DANISH HOLIDAY EXHIBIT AT ASI

Open through January 12, 2020

There's still time to see this year's Nordic Jul Rooms exhibition at the American Swedish Institute (ASI). This year's immersive exploration takes a tour of the decades since ASI was



founded in 1929 through the lenses of the Nordic and Celtic people. Set in the decades of the 1960s & 1970s, this year's Danish Room explores the sculptural aspect of Danish Modern design.

The Danish room shines a light on the height of all things "Danish Modern" with a mid-century lamp installation suspended above the Library's table. Thanks to our partners at Danish Teak Classics, we see notable pieces of furniture from Arne Jacobsen's masterwork, the SAS Royal Hotel in Copenhagen, and a number of examples of the futuristic genius of Vernor Panton. A Christmas-

themed seating area features a pair of iconic Grete Jalk chairs alongside their nesting side table counterparts. As you exit the reading room to the north, don't miss the vintage 1960s Anton Michelsen Christmas spoons. These stunning miniature works of art are from the collection of Mariana and Craig Shulstad.
