Birthday parties are fun! How do people in Denmark celebrate?
On April 5 the DAC will be celebrating Hans Christian
Andersen's 215th birthday. Many of us know his legacy of stories and paper cutting. This party will be a chance to learn about



the Danish birthday traditions while enjoying songs, reenacted HC Andersen stories, a lecture for the adults, activities for the children, and a taste of the Danish-style birthday cake that will be decorated by the children. The party begins at 2pm with music and stories. Around 3pm, we will have a presentation with discussion by Paul Houe, professor emeritus of Scandinavian languages and literature at the University of Minnesota, entitled, "What Kind of Dane was Hans Christian Andersen?" During that time, the children and interested adults will engage in various creative Danish birthday activities in the Dining Room including making Gækkebrev (Snowdrop Letters). Around 4pm we will gather in the Dining Room, eat birthday cake and view the crafts made by the children. The party will end by 5pm. Come for all or come for some.

DANEBO READING CIRCLE

Sunday, March 15: 1:30-3:30pm

The March selection for the Danebo Reading Circle is *This Should Be Written in the Present Tense* by Helle Helle, one of Denmark's most popular and esteemed authors. She is the recipient of many prizes and awards, including the Golden Laurel, the Danish Critics' Prize, the Beatrice Prize, and the Lifetime Award of the Danish Arts Council. Her novels and short stories, from 1993 until the present, have been translated into 15 languages.

This short novel (186 pages) from 2011 was the author's English-language debut in the 2015 translation by Martin Aitken. The publisher (Soft Skull Press/Counterpoint: Berkeley, CA) issued this description: "Dorte is twenty and adrift, pretending to study literature at Copenhagen University. In reality she is riding the trains and clocking up random encounters in her new home by the railway tracks. She remembers her ex, Per—the first boyfriend she tells us about, and the first she leaves—as she enters a new world of transient relationships, random sexual experiences and awkward attempts to write." Kirkus Reviews described the novel as a "sort of realism that is at once technically stringent and mordantly amusing."

Gitte Mohr will be the March 15 discussion leader.

Members contribute treats, both sweet and savory, as


74TH ANNUAL FOLK MEETING SAVE THE DATE

DANSK LEGAT IS NOW ACCEPTING SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS FOR THE FALL 2020 SEMESTER

Dansk Legat, The Upper Midwest Rebild Scholarship Corporation supports U.S. university students to study in Denmark, with the aim of helping to strengthen the cultural and friendship ties between our two countries. Students of Danish background or students who have demonstrated a strong interest and commitment to Denmark and topics pertinent to Denmark's history, language, art/architecture, political and social policies, urban design, scientific, and innovations are eligible. Past awards have been made to U.S. students studying in Copenhagen, Arhus and other locations in Denmark and they range between \$1000-\$3000.

- April 20, 2020 for Fall 2020 Semester
- October 20, 2020 for Winter/Fall 2021
 Semester

The application, along with detailed criteria, timing and instructions is available online at **umrsc.org**. Applications are open to U.S. citizens or permanent residents attending any U.S. college or university, registered to study abroad in Denmark for a minimum of one semester/trimester. *Summer programs are not eligible*.
